THE IRONMAN TRIATHLON

If you wanted to create a sport that really tested the levels of its competitors' physical fitness, you would find it difficult to think of anything as tough as the Ironman Triathlon. It is one of the most difficult one-day sporting events in the world. Believe it or not, it began in Hawaii in 1977 as a challenge between three friends. They wanted to compete against each other to find out who would win if they had a race which involved running, cycling and swimming.

The first Ironman Triathlon was a historic event. The three Hawaiian friends, together with 12 other enthusiastic fitness fanatics, spent seven months preparing for it. No doubt some of the first competitors would have trained harder if they had known how tough it was going to be. That's because, in the end, several competitors failed to complete the grueling challenge of a four-kilometre swim in the ocean followed by a 180-kilometre cycle and, finally, a 42-kilometre run. Since then, the event has grown worldwide. There have been triathlon championships in Europe since 1982 and the first Spanish competition took place in Santander.

As you might expect, since its beginning the triathlon has attracted outstanding athletes from all over the world. If there is one athlete who is particularly special in the sport's history, it has to be Lyn Lemaire, the first woman to complete the course. She became the first winner of the women's race at the Ironman championship in 1979. As a matter of fact, she only needed to finish the race to win as she was the only woman competitor in the field. She came fifth. Since then, many more women have participated in the competition.
